I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

Skate San Francisco 2023 will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the <u>current rulebook</u>, as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, collegiate club or be an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the <u>rulebook</u> for more information



ICEMEN



Skate SF 2023 is a participant in the ICEMEN program, a US Figure Skating program designed to help build camaraderie between male skaters and to keep them in the sport longer through the use of mentors and elite athletes. The Men's SP and Boys FS events will be scheduled together on Saturday and, when concluded, wrap up with a bowling and pizza party!

ADULT COMPETITION SERIES

Adult pre-bronze and adult bronze program/free skate events that meet Adult Competition Series guidelines are offered at this competition. Adult Competition Series participants must submit a photo, scanned copy, email attachment or screenshot of the results sheet to adultcompetitionseries@gmail.com by the deadline published in the most recent Adult CompetitionSeries Handbook to receive credit and series points.

II. ELIGIBILITY

TEST LEVEL

As of December 1, 2022, singles athletes may opt to accelerate their test progression within U.S. Figure Skating and thus compete at level(s) best suited for their technical skillset. Athletes must still meet the minimum requirements for each level and additionally, if participating within the National Qualifying Series (NQS) or National Excel Series (Excel), they will establish a **competitive floor**.

The <u>competitive floor</u> is the lowest level an athlete can compete at and is determined only by the level selected through the EMS Series Application for NQS or Excel and is not uniquely tied to competition registration (regardless of series participation).

Eligibility Notes:

- 1. If an athlete participates in BOTH Excel and NQS, their NQS level may be ONE lower than their Excel level. For example, if an athlete skates Junior Excel, they may skate Novice NQS.
- 2. The singles free skate test levels will remain as a minimum requirement to compete.
- 3. Athletes may not skate down in any event.
- 4. This update does NOT apply to Adult, Showcase and Solo Dance.

Note: The Short Program (SP) and Free Skate (FS) events are combined events for Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior Singles. The Juvenile SP and FS are separate events and the skater has the option of entering the SP and/or the FS event.

COACHES

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into three categories, Coach/Choreographer, Learn-to-Skate USA Instructor, or Foreign Coach/Choreographer. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found https://example.compliance-requirements-must-be-met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

To receive a coach credential, coaches must be listed as primary or secondary coach in the registered skater's EMS profile online, must be fully compliant, and must show a valid ID at registration.

MANDATORY ATHLETES

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SkateSafe compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. FOREIGN SKATER

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition (<u>click here for HOW TO</u>). This can be done by choosing the "Non-Member? Create Account" option on the <u>Members Only</u> login page.

CRITIQUES

Critiques will be offered for <u>\$30.00</u> for the short program <u>(SP) ONLY</u> for the **Juvenile through Senior** well balanced events, including combined events. This does not include Excel events. Sign up through EMS with your event selection when registering.

MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD

EMS MUSIC UPLOAD: Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to EMS no later than August 12, 2023 at 11:59 PM PDT. (Aug. 13 at 2:59 AM EDT) After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a \$25 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

MUSIC CRITERIA

- File Format: MP3 (only format EMS will accept)
 - For assistance with file conversion, click this link: CONVERSION HOW TO
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps or higher and Sample Rate: 44,100 kHz
 - This will be verified by the music chair and they may request you upload a corrected file.
- Leaders and trailers (the silence or "dead space" before and after the actual start and end of the program music) may not exceed two (2) seconds. We prefer that there be NO leaders or trailers at all. Excessive leaders and trailers may disrupt the playing of the music during competition.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rink-side whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) SUBMISSION/UPLOAD

EMS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) — Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EMS no later than August 12, 2023 at 11:59 PM PDT. (Aug. 13 at 2:59 AM EDT) After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a \$25 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

Entry fees will not be refunded **after the August 6, 2023 deadline,** unless no competition exists or the competition is cancelled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals.

Note: The withdrawal of competitor(s) in an event within 48 hours of the event start will not change the status of an event as long as one skater remains; no event will be canceled with at least one competitor, and no refunds provided, within 48 hours of the competition event.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

FACILITY

Competition location: Yerba Buena Ice Skating Center, 750 Folsom St, San Francisco, CA 94107 The rink size is 200' by 85' with rounded corners, (standard NHL size). House lights only. One wall of the rink is all glass windows, so there is plenty of light. The rink has a new WIFI and sound system and a pro shop with full skate services available to the athletes and their coaches.

The grounds around the rink make a very nice place for warming up outside, weather permitting, of course. There are walk ways, many grassy areas, and a playground area with a cushioned surface. Please be mindful and considerate if there are other people using the playground.



LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS

Locker rooms and changing areas will NOT be available to competitors at this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive to the arena competition-ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Ready Rooms will be provided to athletes as an area to put skates on or leave your bags while competing, but there will be NO CHANGING in the Ready Rooms, public restrooms, or in the lobby area. We ask your cooperation in all areas regarding any safety procedures that will be in place at Skate SF 2023.

US FIGURE SKATING TRAVEL POLICY

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the SkateSafe Handbook.

OFFICIAL WEBSITE & UPDATES

All updates and notices will be posted here at the Official Competition Website as well as on the club website at www.scsf.org. The Official Schedule will be posted on these two sites as well as on a roller board at the rink. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent, and/or coach to frequently check for notices posted regarding any schedule changes and/or additional information. We will be utilizing a live results link from U.S. Figure Skating for event results. There will be QR codes for this link posted around the rink, and also on the back of your credential.

SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

PRACTICE ICE

Practice ice will be purchased through EMS. There will be limited sessions available and all will be 20-minute Unofficial Practice Ice (UPI) sessions. No program music will be played on any sessions. After registration, skaters may obtain one practice ice credit during a pre-purchase window which will close on **August 7, 2023 at 11:59 PM PDT**, when registration closes. From August 13 at 9 AM PDT through August 16, 11:59 PM PDT there will be a selection period where skaters may choose their practice ice sessions. On August 17 at 9 AM, OPEN SALES will begin and all remaining practice ice slots will be sold to all skaters on a first come, first served basis. Open sales will run through the end of the competition or until all slots are sold. More information can be found in EMS.



There will be NO REFUNDS for any practice ice sessions purchased, and sessions may not be resold to, traded with, or otherwise exchanged with other competitors.

ONSITE CHECK-IN

Registration will begin on Friday August 18, 2023 one hour before the first event and end on Sunday, August 20, 2023 at the conclusion of the last event. Registration will be located inside the arena at the skate rental counter, and will be done online through EMS. Please read all signage at the event!

Skaters are requested to arrive 1 hour prior to the scheduled time of their event to check in outside at pre-registration. They will enter the arena 45 minutes before event for event registration. DO NOT BE LATE. Competitors will then have ample time in the inside warm up area. After skating, skaters will exit the ice at the Zamboni corner (where they entered) as this is where the Kiss and Cry will be set up.

Please make sure you have paid any outstanding late fees or any amounts due prior to checking in. You will not be credentialed if you have an outstanding balance due for any reason, and there will be no time to pay it at check-in. DO NOT be late as events may begin as much as 30 minutes before the scheduled starting time at the Chief Referee's discretion.

All competitors will receive **one spectator pass on each day they compete** and all competitors, compliant coaches and officials, and volunteers will receive credential identification badges. Coaches must be listed in the skater's EMS profile. There will be a **\$25** fee for any lost/replacement credentials.

<u>Additional Spectators</u> will be allowed at this competition for a \$20/day gate admission fee for all spectators 5 years of age and over. Tickets will be available for purchase in advance of the competition through Eventbrite or may be purchased onsite prior to entry using the QR code at the outside check-in table.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented to the winners of 1st through 4th place for Juvenile through Senior singles qualifying levels, and for 1st through 4th for non-qualifying levels, including all Excel events, as well as for Intermediate through Senior Combined singles. For Juvenile and Open Juvenile singles, 1st through 4th place awards will also be given for the Short Program.

<u>There will be no official photographer.</u> Awards will be presented outside of the rink, during ice cuts, by officials and/or the LOC as soon as possible following the posting of results. Photos may be taken by family and friends of competitors after the awards are given out.



Five trophies will be awarded for eligible skaters competing in contested events:

- The Ray Alperth Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the adult man or lady with the highest IJS component score in a Masters Free Skate event.
- <u>The Barbara Ray Blois Memorial Trophy</u> will be awarded to the winner of the Junior Ladies combined event.
- <u>The John Rogers Memorial Trophy</u> will be awarded to the man with the highest IJS free skate score (Juvenile through Senior),
- <u>The Michele Monnier Honorary Trophy</u> will be awarded to the lady with the highest IJS free skate score (Juvenile through Senior).
- <u>The Irene Newman Memorial Trophy</u> will be awarded to the Pre-Juvenile boy with the highest component score.

VOLUNTEER COMPLIANCE

Reminder: Compliant positions at all U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned events, include key LOC members, and <u>ALL</u> medical event personnel. To be considered compliant, an approved volunteer serving in one of these positions must:

- ✓ Must submit information for, proper payment of \$30 and successfully pass a background check*
 - The background check will be valid for two seasons, the one in which it was completed plus one additional
- ✓ Must complete annual SkateSafe (SafeSport) Training
 - The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification *

PHOTO/VIDEO

In accordance with U.S. Figure Skating policies, personal videotaping (digital or otherwise) is allowed of one's own skater, or one's own performance only, and only with handheld equipment in the seating area. The recording of other skaters AND/OR the recording of warm ups and practice sessions is prohibited. Only battery-powered video units are allowed (no electrical cords). The use of a tri-pod and/or standing near the railing to film is also prohibited.

Please note: Flash photography of the competition, including practice ice, is strictly prohibited per U.S. Figure Skating policy. The flash may cause distraction leading to error or injury. Taking photos of any skater other than your own is prohibited without their express written consent, a copy of which must be provided to the host club.
